# ANA – Administration for Native Americans

- <https://www.acf.hhs.gov/ana/grants>
- 12, 24, 36, 60 month durations
- Average award \$230,000
- “provides opportunities to assess, plan, develop and implement projects to ensure the survival and continuing vitality of native languages”
- “The Esther Martinez Immersion is a Special Initiative ... provides funding to support three-year projects being implemented by Native American Language Nests, Survival Schools, and Restoration Programs.”

# Endangered Languages Documentation Programme (ELDP)

- Small Grants
  - £10,000 maximum
  - up to 12 months
- Individual Graduate Scholarships
  - up to 3 years
  - field trip costs, stipend
- Individual Postdoctoral Fellowship
  - 12-24 months
- Major Documentation Project
  - £10,000-£150,000
  - 6-36 months

# Endangered Language Fund (ELF)

- Language Legacies program:
  - 1 year grants
  - average \$2,500
- Native Voices Endowment:
  - restricted to members of the Native American tribes that came in contact with the Lewis and Clark Expedition between 1803-1806
  - 1-3 year grants
  - \$2,500-\$10,000/year

# Phillips Fund for Native American Research

- American Philosophical Society
- “prefers to support the work of younger scholars who have received the doctorate”
- average award \$3,200 (grants do not exceed \$3,500)
- 1 year duration

# Jacobs Research Funds

- Individual grant: \$3,000
- Group grant (two or more researchers): \$6,000
- Kinkade grant: \$9,000
- “Priority is given to research on endangered cultures and languages, and to research on the Pacific Northwest.”

- \$1,000 maximum grant
