Airport Transportation

If you're leaving today or preparing to leave tomorrow, public transit directions from the hotels are as follows: Exit the hotel. The Courthouse Station will be 1/2 block on your right (if you're exiting the Grand America) or on your left (if you're exiting the Little America). Take a Green Line train in the direction of the Airport Station. Trains run every 20 minutes on weekends, and the trip takes about 1/2 hour. The fare is \$2.50. More information is available here.
