LSA Publishes Proceedings of its 2016 Annual Meeting; Completes BLS Archive

The LSA is excited to announce the publication of the inaugural volume of the [Proceedings of the Linguistic Society of America](#). The *Proceedings* is the successor to the [LSA Annual Meeting Extended Abstracts](#), which since 2010 has given presenters of research at the LSA Annual Meeting a platform to publish four-page versions of their work in a platinum open-access format. Beginning with this first volume of the *Proceedings*, annual meeting presenters can publish even longer versions of their work -- up to 15 pages. The current volume of the *Proceedings* contains extended versions of thirty-seven of the 20-minute posters and papers presented at the January 2016 Annual Meeting.

The [Proceedings of the Berkeley Linguistics Society](#) have been available on the LSA website and its eLanguage platform since 2009. Volume 39 has just recently been added so as to now make the archive complete from Vol 1 - 40. In existence since 1975, the Berkeley Linguistics Society is the second-oldest student-run linguistics conference in the United States.

The LSA publishes the proceedings of several meetings, including the Annual Meetings on Phonology (AMP), Semantics and Linguistic Theory (SALT), and the LSA's own Annual Meeting. A full list is available [here](#).
